




REFLECTION

Signs of Mercy and Love

On his deathbed in 1963, Pope John XXIII is reported to have said: "Those who have lived as

long as I have ... were enabled to compare different cultures and traditions, and know that the moment has come to discern the signs of the times, to seize the opportunity and to look far ahead." During his short pontificate, he had discerned the signs of the



Ahaz was told to ask for a sign, but out of fear of wearying the Lord, he refused. Yet a sign was given, a sign we know as incarnation, God who is with us, our Emmanuel. Mary would bear this Son and Joseph would protect and provide for Mary and the Child.

As we approach the Christmas mystery, we are to be a sign of God's presence to one another and to the world. Like St. Paul who was given "the grace of apostleship", we too are called to spread the good news of God's love and mercy revealed in Jesus. As members of the Body of Christ, we are to be a sign and sacrament of God's presence to all those in need.

One way we make present and manifest God's presence is by practicing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. This was the singular message of the now-sainted Pope John XXIII: "God is with us in the mystery of Jesus". He is the sign of divine mercy and love; he is the standard by which we discern the signs of our times.

LITURGY FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

Ahaz receives from Isaiah a prophecy that he will be successful in war and is urged to ask for a sign that the prophecy is true. The sign is "The virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel."

Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7

Paul greets the Romans by pointing out that Jesus is the Christ who was promised to them in Scripture. He, Paul, is the apostle favored with the task of spreading the name of Christ to all.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

In a brief, straightforward, simple narrative, Matthew recounts the events leading to Jesus' birth. He details the appearance of the angel in a dream to Joseph and stresses that "All this happened to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophets."




